Stewardship—Simplicity and Generosity

The Stewardship committee is embarking on a journey to explore with the congregation the concept of Stewardship as a faith based response to God's love and generosity. At the heart of this approach is the belief that we are called to simplicity and generosity. This is not just about money (though, in honesty, a part of it involves money) but about a range of activities that comprise Stewardship. You will see pictures in the church that will show how people are deeply involved in various church activities, all variations of a faith based stewardship response.

We will be starting a financial stewardship campaign in November. This will involve letters, temple talks and an opportunity for the congregation to commit time, talents and money to St. Paul's. However, beyond the Stewardship Campaign, throughout the year we hope to explore ways to understand stewardship as part of a Christian call to live a simpler life. In turn, it is hoped that this will lead us all to an understanding that stewardship responses may flow from our faith through Simplicity and Generosity. We look forward to opportunities to listen and explore concepts of Christian stewardship through a simpler lifestyle.

OUR PRAYER LIFE

Why do we pray? Is it to ask God for something we are lacking? Is it to find someone who will listen to our struggles with an ever-listening and loving ear? Is it out of concern for the challenges of those we love? Is it to say thanks for the blessings we have received from God? Are there other reasons? As many as there are persons who pray there are an equal number of reasons. But, why should we pray? And about what should we pray?

It is interesting to note that when Jesus discusses prayer, and when he prays himself, he makes the point to include as the object of prayer our enemy. In Matthew 5 we read, "You have heard that it was said, 'You shall love your neighbor and hate your enemy.' But I say to you, Love your enemies and pray for those who persecute you." Prayer, especially intercessory prayer, and most particularly *Christian* intercessory prayer, if it is authentic, must also include those whom we cannot stand. Harsh and challenging,

but true.

In a course I'm taking on Dietrich Bonhoeffer I came across a passage from his *Life Together* that speaks to this very point.

A Christian community either lives by the intercessory prayers of its members for one another, or the community will be destroyed. I can no longer condemn or hate other Christians for whom I pray, no matter how much trouble they cause me. In intercessory prayer the face that may have been strange and intolerable to me is transformed into the face of one for whom Christ died, the face of a pardoned sinner. That is a blessed discovery for the Christian who is beginning to offer intercessory prayer for others. As far as we are concerned, there is no dislike, no personal tension, no disunity or strife, that cannot be overcome by intercessory prayer. Intercessory prayer is the purifying bath into which the individual and the community must enter every day.

(Dietrich Bonhoeffer, *Life Together*, from *Dietrich Bonhoeffer Works*, vol. 5 (Minniapolis: Augsburg Fortress Press, 2005) p. 90.)

When we include even our enemy in our prayers, they are transformed in our hearts—no longer excluded as our enemy, but through Christ included in the concern and embrace of our love.

Imagine the world in which such prayer was the norm and not the exception and you will imagine the community to which we are called.
