CONGRATULATIONS TO OUR CONFIRMANDS!

On Pentecost Sunday, May 19, nine of our youths affirmed their baptismal covenant (the promises made at the time of their baptism) before the whole congregation through the rite of Confirmation.

Confirmed were: Brayson Bernard, Breen Bernard III, Evan Bernard, Cameron Cheyney, Celia Cheyney, Jared Christensen, Bryce Gentino, Max Gentino, and Collin Grottke. Each one of these confirmands chose a verse from the Bible and reflected upon the significance of their verse for their life of faith.

Reflecting on Psalm 27:1, Brayson observed that, "This passage is saying that no matter what, God is with you and there is nothing to be afraid of. God will always stand by you in the thick and the thin and be by your side."

Breen, reflecting upon the unity in Christ promised in Galatians 3:27-28, talked about Billy, a man many of us also know and love, who has Down syndrome, and who is like a brother to Breen. Summing it all up he explained, "All I'm trying to say is, 'Don't judge a book by its cover,' because it just might turn out to be the best book you've ever read."

Evan chose Colossians 3:12-14 and shared, "You have to forgive, because God forgives you for all your sins. So you also must forgive other people if they sin against you, no matter what they did to you and even if it is really hard to forgive."

Cameron chose Proverbs 3:5-6 and spoke of a time when he was lost in Disney Land or, more recently, when he was unable to breath and had to be rushed to the hospital. In each of these scary moments he found strength and comfort in his scripture verse: "Trust in the Lord with your whole heart."

Celia shared her love for Psalm 23, which "has really helped me during certain times because it talks of God being there for you always and even though I walk through the darkest valley I fear no evil for you are with me."

You're probably asking yourself how these stores help us raise money. It's simple — scrip participating retailers agree to sell gift certificates to our organization at a discount. Member families like yours buy the certificates for full face value, they redeem them for full face value,

and St. Paul's Church keeps the difference as revenue. And scrip is exciting, because everybody wins:


- The retailer gets cash up front and repeat business...
- · You get a powerful fundraising alternative that involves *no selling*...
- · Our church gets a regular source of revenue.

The beauty of scrip is that you put your regular house-hold shopping dollars to work. You earn money for our church without spending a single additional penny. Just spend your regular shopping dollars with scrip at the stores that participate in the scrip program! And scrip can be used for just about any household purchase including food, clothing, entertainment, gasoline and even dining out.

In the past 4 months we have raised over \$600! This is with only a small number of people participating. Example: Think of what you spend on gasoline and groceries per month. Four percent of that total could be going to St. Paul's each month if you were to make those purchases with pre purchased Stop and Shop cards. Jared chose 1 John 4:16, especially where it affirms that "God is love." "When I realized that 'God is love' was when my Grandpa died. ... The funeral helped me through it, so did the burial. That was God's love, and it helped me feel better and face the fact that [my Grandpa] was in a better place, up in heaven with [my Grandma]."

Bryce, drawing upon the "marvelous light of Christ" promised in 1 Peter 2:9, proclaimed, "If we turn around to the darkness [which takes many forms] and face it head on, the darkness scatters like a coward when we show that we possess the courage and commitment to beat it back."

For Max, his passage, Isaiah 41:10, will "guide me through life with my head held high and a smile on my face, for the Lord is with me and always has my back."

Colin, also drawing upon Isaiah 41:10, concluded, "I'd like to offer reassurance to all people who are sad, scared, or very ill that God is always with them and never stops loving and caring for them."

Nine voices of faith from young theologians. I believe I share the sentiments of us all when I pray that God's Holy Spirit, poured out on Pentecost, might inspire and empower each of these confirmands as they begin their journeys of faith as young adults.
