# WHAT I LEARNED DURING VACATION BIBLE CAMP

Yes, we all can learn something from VBC.

This year's VBC theme was "Everest: Conquering Challenges with God's Mighty Power." Each day we learned another amazing truth about God:

First: God has the power to provide. In a world that is so fixated on the acquisition of wealth as one of the primary means to prove our value to the world (which tends to produce a few winners and a lot of losers) this foundational truth is the secret to understanding real wealth: It's not in how much you keep, but in how much you give away that the real richness of life is to be found. As Paul wrote to the Corinthians: "God will generously provide all you need." (2 Cor. 9:8) Kind of takes the worry away.

Secondly: God has the power to comfort. So often we think of comfort as a luxury that some enjoy and others only yearn for. But the comfort that God provides is experienced when, in the midst of life's troubles, we gain a glimmer of hope. The comfort that God provides often comes through the love of others. St. Paul tells us, "God comforts us in all our troubles **so that** we can comfort others." (2 Cor. 1:4, emphasis added.) Again, we receive in order to give away.

Thirdly: God has the power to heal. Psalm 147:3 reminds us that "God heals the brokenhearted and bandages their wounds." Healing can come in so many forms. And while we live in a world that seeks a cure for everything that ails us (even death!), the kind of healing that God offers is a restoration to *spiritual* wholeness even while we remain broken. Kind of a paradox: through God our own woundedness can become a source of healing for others.

And finally: God has the power to love us forever. Jesus told us that everyone who believes in him will have eternal life. (John 3:15) The "forever" part of God's love puts things in perspective. While we so often obsess over the short-term and seek immediate gratification (thank you modern technology!), God's time-frame is eternal. So . . . what's the rush?

Want to learn more? Ask the children who attended VBC this year. They'll tell you to "HOLD ON!" To God's truth, that is.
