### A MESSAGE FROM PASTOR ELIZABETH

Dear Members and Friends of St. Paul's,

Return to the Lord, your God, who is gracious and merciful, slow to anger, and abounding in steadfast love. (Joel 2:13)

This month we continue to journey through the season of Lent. We are joining with other churches in our synod for mid-week Bible study. The series, Encountering God, begins with a short video where the presenter introduces the topic and scripture. We will then engage in open conversation around the table exploring our faith and seeing how God is active in our lives. Our evening concludes with a service of Holden Evening Prayer in the sanctuary at 7:00pm. Thank you to the cantors who will be leading us in the meditative prayer service this year.

Holy week will begin with the Palm Sunday worship service on March 24. We will gather on the front lawn (if the weather cooperates) with our palms and parade around the building and into the sanctuary. We will also hear the reading of The Passion according to St. Mark and come together at the Lord's Table to celebrate Holy Communion.

The Great Three Days begins on Maundy (Holy) Thursday, March 28. We will be reminded of Jesus' last meal with his disciples and how he humbled himself by washing their feet. There will be an opportunity for the congregation to have their feet washed during this service. We will also see the altar stripped in preparation for the continuation of worship the next day.

Good Friday's worship on March 29 is a Tenebrae service. You will enter into the empty sanctuary, and will hear the words from The Passion according to St. John. After each reading, a candle will be extinguished.

It is powerful to see the light being snuffed out only to be brought back on Easter Sunday. The day of Resurrection, the day when we gather to celebrate Christ being raised from the dead and bring back the Alleluias that have been buried for the past six weeks.

I continue to keep you all in my prayers as you travel through the wilderness of Lent. You belong to God and were marked with the cross of Christ forever in your baptism.

Please remember to bring a fresh flower to church on <u>March 31st!!</u>




Spring Bake Sale Saturday, March 23rd 9:00 am - 1:00 pm
