The Food Pantry has been very busy. Each week the Pantry is welcoming new clients.

St. Paul's Congregation can be very proud of the way we are helping and serving the community in which we live.

We are very thankful to our members who have always come through when the need is there. Connecticut Food Share isn't getting the donations from the food company;

therefore the local food pantries have to rely on their donors. A lot of food is being sent overseas.

Our Food Pantry has passed two inspections by Connecticut Food Share and by a government agency TEPA. Elaine Strecker and Jerry Hansen are working with a representative of Connecticut Food Share to change the company's way of keeping track of the clients who use Foodshare.

We are staying grateful to our Congregation and our volunteers for the work they do in serving the people in need in our community!



UPDATING FIRST AID KITS

In the perspective of being stewards of God's profuse gifts, including our lives themselves, and our responsibility and blessing to be engaged in our own and our neighbor's opportunities for health, which open up the great panoply of promising possibilities for growth, service, and fullillment for us:

We are taking to the small but important task of updating the first aid kits which stand at the ready for the congregation and others who use or visit St. Paul's building and grounds.

Assessment so far reveals that the current contents of the two kits are rather old and should be replaced. Some upgrades in content are also deemed worthwhile.

While we will focus on anticipating needs for occasional, accidental, small, superficial wound first aid and a few general symptoms of minor common ailments and illnesses, some thoughtfully chosen upgrades in the first aid kits' contents will also be made.

One proactive member who heard of the project just underway has generously offered to cover the cost of some of the first aid supplies, such as bandages, tape, sterile dressings, and antibiotic ointment we'll need to refresh the kits.

If others would care to make a monetary contribution to this project as well, it would be useful and much appreciated. Contributions to "St. Paul's Ev. Lutheran Church" with a memo line notation for "first aid project" will be put to good use for supplies to be at the ready, to enable us to be God's hands in a time of need.




Jesus Dies and Rises Up


