St. Paul's Evangelical Lutheran Church's Prayer Chain Ministry

Over 40 years ago, St. Paul's Prayer Chain was begun as part of the Lutheran Church Women organization, which was at that time a very active and sizable

group of women, who felt the need to provide personal prayer support for those dealing with difficult health and personal concerns. The Prayer Chain continues to provide prayerful support for those who express their requests to Pastor Elizabeth or to me. Requests may be made in person, via telephone or email. In times of special need, we can add our concerned prayers for God's guidance and support for those seeking His strength and help in their lives. We also are privileged to share times of requested prayers of joy. All requests are kept confidential within the Prayer Chain personnel. I am pleased to say we have welcomed our first male member into the Prayer Chain Ministry, so we are now a coed group of praying people.

I begin the Prayer Chain by passing on a request to the first person in each of two links. That person makes one telephone call to the next person on their link. Presently, we have four people participating in the Telephone Chain Ministry. There are six people, who are receiving prayer requests from me via email. Members can share prayer needs in the privacy of their home or wherever they may be and at a time of their own choosing. As we know, God is always ready to receive our prayers!

DO YOU KNOW EXACTLY HOW OUR FOOD PANTRY OPERATES EVERY WEEK?

FIRST, A LITTLE HISTORY: The Food Pantry at St. Paul's started many years ago (at least as far back as 2011) first led by former members Don Krug and then Dave Bayek. Both laid the foundation for what the food pantry has become in 2024.

Jerry Hansen took the helm of the pantry in 2019. Since then, the need for food has grown greatly and we have more and more people visiting each week.

While the pantry is open from 10:00-1:00 on Thursdays, there is much preparation that goes into getting it ready for the families that come each week.

We order most of our food from Connecticut Food Share. About five years ago, we were in danger of losing our ability to order from Connecticut Food Share because we did not meet the quota of giving out 3,000 pounds of food in a year. In 2021, we distributed 16,069 pounds of food from Connecticut Food Share. Last year in 2023, we gave away more than 40,835 pounds of food! See how we have grown!

We supplement the food ordered from Connecticut Food Share with donations from local stores and donations from our St. Paul's family. Wednesday is "Delivery Day"! Team Members arrive at the church at 7:00 to prepare for the deliveries. They go out to visit Big Y, Stop and Shop and Aldi's and load up their trucks with breads, desserts, fruits, vegetables and dairy products that these stores donate. All of these items are brought back to St. Paul's between 8:30 and 9:30. The next day, not only are our patrons getting non-perishables, they get to choose breads, desserts, yogurts, fresh fruits and whatever else might have been donated that week from these stores.

These stores also donate frozen food. We work with the town food pantry to get the frozen items transported safely from store to pantry. Recently, our meat delivery has included frozen items including venison, whole chickens, cookie dough, bacon and lunch meat-always a wide variety! Families can often choose two meat items.

WHAT DOES FOOD PANTRY DAY LOOK LIKE AT ST. PAUL'S??

- Members of the team arrive on Thursday as early as 7:00 to get the
 pantry ready-tables set up, food picked up on Wednesday is displayed
 on the tables, forms ready (each household can circle the items they
 would like to have placed in their bags) and instructions given to the
 team.
- We open at 10:00 officially. On a recent Thursday in May, the line started forming at 9:15 and by 9:30 there were 8 people waiting. We will open earlier if we are ready. On this same day, by the official start time of 10:00 we had already served 12 families.
- As one member of the team is filling the order for food, another is guiding the visitor around the table of food items from the stores. It is very uplifting to see these people leave with the food they need to feed their family for another week. They are always so very appreciative of what we are able to give to them. Families can visit every two weeks.
- If it is a food delivery week from Connecticut FoodShare, the
 delivered food must be brought downstairs and the shelves need to be
 restocked, often while we are serving our patrons. This is a huge job!
- We serve about 50 households a week which means approximately 150-200 people are benefitting from our ministry. It is a challenge to keep our shelves stocked.
- Since Covid, the price of food has substantially increased. We recently paid \$350 for 700 pounds of food. As quickly as the food is stocked, it is given away.
- Jerry applied for and our Food Pantry recently received a \$3,000 grant from Connecticut Foodshare. This money cannot be used for the purchase of food but it will be most helpful to purchase more storage. Presently we have a freezer and a refrigerator in the pantry and we use the freezer in the kitchen. Jerry is currently investigating the cost of purchasing another freezer and additional shelving on wheels. We will share information about these purchases in an upcoming article.

Thank you to all at St. Paul's who continue to donate food. We will be announcing each week during Sunday announcements the food items that we especially need for the coming week.

We welcome anyone who might be interested in helping out or would like to make a visit some Thursday to see how we operate!
