Dear Members and Friends of St. Paul's,

As we enter the Fall season, and return to our 10:00am worship service schedule, I pray that you had a wonderful summer and had time to rest, relax, and rejuvenate. I enjoyed some time away with my family and even got the chance to hold my baby niece a few times over the past few months! Thank you for keeping my sister and brother-in-law in your prayers as they welcomed their baby girl at the beginning of June.

Bishop Pipho, who was elected as the fourth bishop of the New England Synod during the Synod Assembly in June, began his 6-year term on August 1. He will be installed at a Festive Holy Eucharist on Saturday, September 7, 2024, at 1:00 p.m. at Trinity Lutheran Church, 73 Lancaster Street, Worcester, MA. The Rev. Elizabeth Eaton, Presiding Bishop of the ELCA will preside and a reception will follow. We are all invited to attend. The liturgy will also be livestreamed at www.vimeo.com/trinityworcester.

On the following day, September 8, we will once again join with Our Savior's Lutheran Church from Newington for "God's Work, Our Hands" Sunday. We will worship together that morning and following the service, we will put together Blessing Bags for the first responders in our communities. This is a tangible way for us to carry out our baptismal calling by being the hands and feet of God in our community.

I hope you will also join us as we host a table at Cornfest (provided it doesn't get rained out again this year) on September 14 at Cove Park. By being active and visible in our community we are better able to share the love of God with others.



ST. PAUL'S FOOD PANTRY RECAP

Our pantry has had a busy summer! We were open every Thursday during July and August including the 4th of July! Due to the economy, our numbers have increased, and we would like to share details about this ministry St. Paul's is doing throughout our community:

Connecticut Food Share has provided us with 5,600 pounds of food. Big Y, Stop and Shop, and Aldi's gave us 10,000 pounds of food. The donations from our church members, friends, and Hutchinson Farm are not accounted for but we are truly grateful for their generosity. We are so thankful to the owners of City Fish for helping with the delivery of our frozen meat. Without their help, the Food Pantry would not be allowed to give out any meat. It is wonderful how the owners of City Fish stepped up to join us in serving the needy.

ST. PAUL'S FOOD PANTRY RECAP (cont'd)

We received a \$3,000 grant from Connecticut Foodshare. The funds were used to purchase a commercial size freezer and refrigerator. This has given the pantry additional cold storage for the frozen meats that are donated by local food stores. It was QUITE a struggle to get the two units from the parking lot to the downstairs pantry. The freezer weighs 750 pounds, and the refrigerator weighs 500 pounds!!

Special thanks to Jerry Hansen, Martial Roy, Chris Bengtson Jr, Walter Ruppar, Justin Lord, David Horrigan, Cameron Cheyney, Alice Ruppar and Sophia, Janice Gengras and Judy Lundin who worked tirelessly in the July heat to get them moved, set up and running.

Following approval from the Church Council, Jerry and Martial have worked over the summer to construct a full wall to cordon off the food pantry and give it more space and make it more secure. Be sure to go downstairs in the PE Building and look at their hard work-it is just about finished! This construction will help the pantry operate more efficiently each Thursday morning!

Ongoing thanks to our team-to Jerry and Judy for their continued leadership and to Janice, Elaine, Jo-Ann, Nancy, Debbie, Alice, Sophia, Oliver, Jack, Olivia, Christopher, Sue, Justin, Josh, Walter, Dick, Bruce, and Bob. As always, we continue to thank and appreciate all the monetary and food donations that come from our St. Paul's family.
