

We have been averaging close to 60 patrons each week and one week this month we were close to 75 people, a new record. The need continues to grow and the team works very hard to meet these needs each week. As fast as our shelves are stocked and full, they are just about empty every Thursday at closing time.

We thank all of our St. Paul's family for the many donations you continue to give to this important and ever-growing ministry.


St. Paul's Church Fair Update & Highlights:


