All of the hard work done each week by our food pantry team has been recognized! Just last week, our pantry was inspected by a representative from "TEFAP": The Emergency Food Assistance Program. This is part of the U.S. Department of Agriculture's Food and Nutrition Program (USDA) which helps supplement the diets of people that qualify for assistance. They felt our pantry was well orga-

nized and in excellent condition. WE PASSED WITH FLYING COLORS!

We continue to serve as average of 60-70 families per week. We are thankful for the donations from our congregation and the weekly food that is donated and picked up by our team from two Shop and Stops, Aldi's, Big Y and Target. 




#### EXCITING NEWS FOR OUR FOOD PANTRY IN OCTOBER!


